Nutritional Panels are required

Ingredients are required

The word "**Organic**" is not recommended unless the claim is certified. You could use "**100% Natural**" instead.

Your business details are required

Business Name, Address, and Phone Number are required to aid in the rare event of a recall. Website and email address are recommended. If exporting details of importing agent are required.

LABEL REQUIREMENTS FOR AB'S HONEY

Labels that do not meet these specifications can not be applied without prior consultation.

- Label Material must be Poly (pp). We do not recommend high gloss.
- Backing Paper: Opaque.
- Adhesive: Semi-repositionable. Non-repositionable labels cannot be used.
- Required Roll Direction: Left-Hand Leading Edge.
- Required Roll Core Size: 76mm.

Recommended Dimensions (Rectangular):

- Small (250g) jars: 45mm high x 133mm wide.
 - Large (500g +) jars: 61mm high x 163mm wide.
- A minimum area 8mm x34mm is required to print the batch number on. Black ink is used and printing is horizontal.

When ordering, always allow additional labels for set-up and wastage.

Product Description

This can include details about the product, allergens, and storage instructions.

Batch Number required for traceability

Best Before Date

In Australia a Best Before date is not required for foods with a shelf life over 2 years, as per FSANZ advice, we recommend using a Best Before Date.

If exporting formatting requirements will vary dependant on the country.
